BHEZ secured a grant to hire two Community Health Workers to support the Bristol Warren Regional School District for the 22-23 and 23-24 school years. We used this past school year to build relationships with students and families. We were able to connect with hundreds of students throughout the school year and saw over 145 individual students. We were able to help meet families where they are and support the school system through assisting with the behavioral health needs of students and families.
