WARREN HEZ, HOW IT BEGAN AND WHERE IT'S GOING

Established in July 2021, the Warren HEZ partners with residents to identify and act on issues that impact community health and wellness for all who live, work, and learn in our Town.

In 2024, the Warren HEZ collaborative is focusing on activities and systems change- to support teens and young adults, improve resiliency in the face of climate change and make clear the intersections of health and housing affordability.

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) internet program will end in April 2024. Households currently receiving a monthly ACP benefit should get notices from their internet providers about the end of the ACP benefit. CONCERNED ABOUT FLOODING? STAY INFORMED, SHARE YOUR CONCERNS, JOIN US!



The Safety, Resilience and Climate Working Group formed in the spring of 2023 after residents and stakeholders completed a Climate Anxiety Workshop. Building on the ways that we all take care of each other, the group agreed to continue meeting, learning and raising up resident voices. Here two ways to take action:

- <u>CODE RED -</u> Stay informed about emergencies! Text the word 'WarrenRI' to 99411 and enroll in the Town of Warren's emergency alert program. This system is managed by the WVFD and keeps residents informed about dangers such as flooding, outages, fires and missing persons!
- <u>Door Knocking in Market Street</u>: Volunteers from the workgroup are knocking on doors in this neighborhood that deals with frequent flooding, to ask how residents want to get involved and invite them to a monthly meeting. This year, we have had lengthy conversations with 17 individuals and distributed 60 flyers. We hope to see you at your door soon!

New Housing Policies: No More Application Fees & End to Lead Hazard Exemptions

After identifying housing as its <u>top priority</u> this past year, Rhode Island's 2023 General Assembly passed legislation starting in January 2024.

These new laws include:

- Landlords can no longer charge application fees for prospective tenants.
- Tenants can now use their own credit reports and state issued background checks for landlords that require themas long as they are within the past 90 days of applying.
- The exemption for owner-occupied 2/3 unit dwellings from the lead hazard mitigation law has ended.
 All Landlords with property built before 1978 must register with the Department of Health, and any rental unit that was built before 1978 will then need to be certified as safe.

UP TO \$25 MORE ON YOUR SNAP CARD!

According to the RI Department of Human Services Website, "all SNAP recipients are automatically enrolled in the Eat Well, Be Well (EWBW) program. The additional benefits, up to \$25 a month, are loaded to the customer's EBT card for the future purchase of qualifying SNAP products at in-store locations.

Accumulated EWBW rewards are shown on customers' grocery receipts, the HealthyRhode Mobile app, or through the Customer Portal (healthyrhode.ri.gov)."

HELP WITH HEATING COSTS

The Low-Income Heating Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is a seasonal program, running from *October 1, 2023* to May 1, 2024, and income-eligible households may qualify receive a one time per season credit for fuel.
